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Regina Egetenmeyer holds the university professorship for adult and continuing education at Julius-Maximilians-University Würzburg (Germany). She works on questions of lifelong learning, informal learning, and professionalization in adult education and mobility for learning purposes. Regina Egetenmeyer has done several internationally comparative studies with a focus on both Europe and Asia. She has provided scientific support to European development projects with a focus on comparative issues. Regina Egetenmeyer is author of more than 60 papers and editor of the series "Study Guides in Adult Education". She has won funds for the development of innovative teaching projects (e.g. Mentoring-to-Teach) in which she focuses the relations of academic knowledge and educational practice.

Regina Egetenmeyer earned her PhD from the University of Duisburg-Essen. She worked as a research fellow at the University of Duisburg-Essen at the Chair of Adult Education and at the German Institute for Adult Education. From 2010 till 2013 she was professor for lifelong learning (Juniorprofessur) at the University of Mainz/Germany.
