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Stéphane Jacquemet graduated in educational sciences at the University of Geneva (1994). He specialised in continuing education for adults and "ingénierie de la formation". He started his career as chief training officer for the Nursing Care Division of the Geneva University Hospital -HUG- (1995 -1997). From 1997 to 1999, he was pedagogical coordinator of the Diploma of Advanced Studies in Therapeutic Patient Education (DIFEP). He worked as scientific collaborator for the Continuing Education Centre at the University of Geneva, in charge of the evaluation of the quality programmes and the development of the pedagogy of adult education (1999-2003). He joined the Geneva Office for Orientation and Professional Education (OOFP) in 2003 for a two year mission as chief project for the *FormaConseil* Unit. He was also granted 2 representation mandates: to be member of IFAGE's Council of Fondation and member of the *Fédération romande des acteurs de la formation de formateurs d'adultes's* Committee (FRAFFA).

Stéphane Jacquemet possesses a broad experience and expertise in institutional interventions, especially in the field of public education, health and social work issues, company-based training. He is specialist in the field of competences development, pedagogical design (ingénierie de la formation), human resources, institutional management, work and team management, methodology of institutional projects guidance, moderation of working groups, individual and collective coaching of decision makers, professional practices supervision and quality audits.

Stéphane is presently teaching at the Faculty Psychology and Educational Sciences of the University of Geneva and is also training consultant.

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
